PRODUCT INFORMATION

Singeing of udder hair has been common practice in the northern hemisphere for decades.

Hair houses most of your bacteria, eliminate your hair and you eliminate your bacteria. Hair also provides a platform for mud and manure to accumulate, this environment can be a significant cause of environmental Mastitis. Singeing also helps eliminate ticks and biting bugs like lice, such bugs can cause inflamed udders and mastitis

Note: Unit should be operated in a vertical position, if horizontal the liquid part of the gas is released and the flame is increased to a blow torch. We recommended the wand is held with two hands to ensure you have complete control of the unit and the flame.
